

5. Reviews

A. I liked THE BOYS IN THE BOAT a lot more than Cynthia did. The film tells the real-life underdog tale of the University of Washington JV crew team that somehow managed to win a gold metal at the 1936 Olympics. Joel Edgerton stars, along with a bunch of actors I had never seen before. I got a kick out of cameo performances from the actors playing Jesse Owens and Adolf Hitler. Rated PG-13.

B. We were both disappointed with MAESTRO, the biography about Leonard Bernstein, that we saw at Grail Moviehouse but is now on Netflix. The film tells the lifelong relationship between Leonard Bernstein and Felicia Montealegre Cohn Bernstein and features fine performance by Bradley Cooper and Carey Mulligan, respectively. We were also impressed by makeup artist Kazu Hiro's work. But overall, the film felt flat, and I learned little about Bernstein's background. Rated R.

An ornithology student crammed for his final exam. He studied for days. When he got to take it, he walked into the room and saw 25 pictures of birds' feet pinned up on the walls.



She looks up at the teller, pauses for a moment, then realizing her mistake, she says, "Well that's great. Some asshole's got my pen."




11. Three quotes I like
