Beginning Oct. 1, 2020, federal agencies will enforce the REAL ID Act, which requires a REAL ID, U.S. passport or another federally approved identification to board commercial flights and enter secure federal buildings.

So if you're reading this, my strong recommendation is that you find out more about this topic by clicking: [Here](#).

At least for the time being, you could avoid getting the REAL ID by using your passport. But that's a pain having to carry it with you all the time, e.g., when entering a federal building.

Note: You need to do this in person. It can't be done online. But the good news is that you can make an appointment—at least in North Carolina—by calling 919.715.7000.

If you manage to get through, you might have to wait as I did for some three months. But the wait was worth it, in that Cynthia and I got through the process in less than half an hour. Others were waiting for their appointments for some two hours.

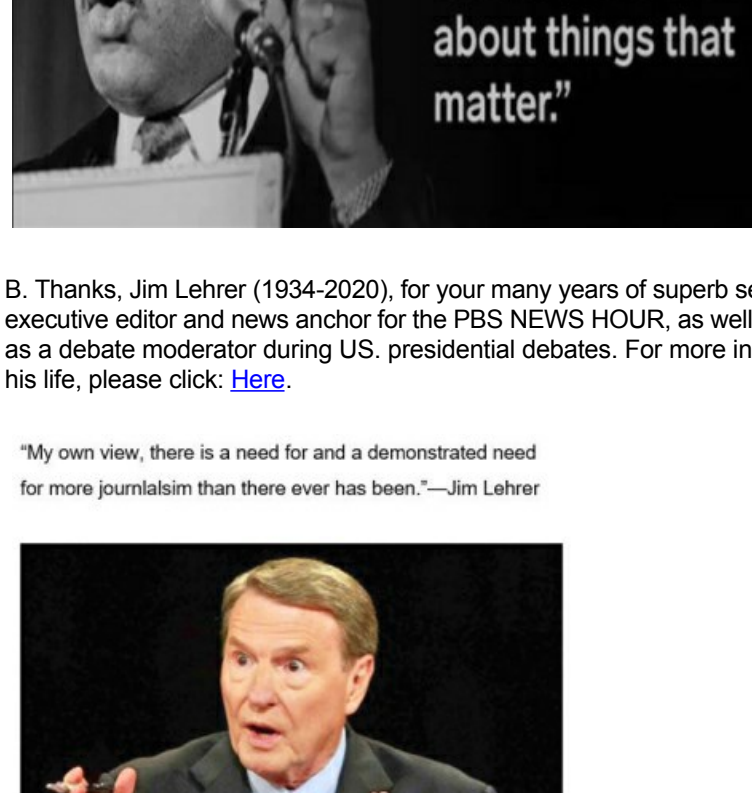

A. Enjoyed KNIVES OUT, a comedic murder mystery that pays tribute to mystery mastermind Agatha Christie. Just about everyone is a suspect in the murder of renowned crime novelist Harlan Thrombey. All in the ensemble cast were good, but in particular, I liked the performances of Daniel Craig (in a role quite different than when you've seen him as James Bond) Don Johnson and Michael Shannon. You'll be kept guessing until the end. My only criticism: The film runs 130 minutes. It could have been easily been shortened, especially at the end. Rated PG-13.

B. Nina Denninger: After turning away from the impeachment hearings in disgust I decided to escape in Netflix. I watched a documentary called "Unacknowledged". EVERYONE ON THE PLANET NEEDS TO SEE THIS. PLEASE MAKE TIME TO WATCH IT. It reveals how, for years, the military/industrial complex has withheld highly advanced technological information from us that can dramatically alter our world and completely revolutionize the way we human beings view one another. Powerful, powerful stuff. If any of you watch it I would love to hear what impact it has on you.
