

(3) An other night, we joined our friend Judy Ray for some delicious Japanese food at Hanna. Nida was our friendly server.



Thanks, Ed Kohlhepp, for the following advice:
Here is an example where a married couple can benefit when both parties have had significant lifetime earnings. Let's assume the husband reaches Full Retirement age, FRA, and files for benefits. The spouse, the wife, can collect her benefits at Full Retirement Age, or alternatively, file and suspend her benefits until age 70. This enables her to collect a spousal benefit until age 70 at which time she switches to her own, higher benefit. Thus, the couple can generally collect higher benefits and still increase their lifetime benefits as a couple.

These strategies are complicated and you should visit your Social Security office to understand all of the options.



A. Saw HOUSE OF D, a sweet coming-of-age drama about a British boy who looks back at his adolescence in New York's Greenwich Village in 1973. David Duchovny made an impressive debut as a director and screenwriter in this film, and he also stars in it, along with Anton Yelchin, Robin Williams and Tea Leoni. The reviews from critics weren't great, but audiences liked it. And so did Cynthia and I—a lot. We found it on HBO, but you may have to dig some to locate a next broadcast or seek it out via a streaming service. Rated PG-13.

C. Heard I LOVE CAPITALISM: AN AMERICAN STORY (Penguin Audio), written and narrated by Ken Langone. ... His story is about a poor boy from Roslyn, NY, who grew up to become one of America's wealthiest individuals. In addition, I found it interesting to find out how he saw through Bernie Madoff and did not become involved with any business deals with him. ... I would have also liked to have read more about Home Depot, a company he helped start. ... Though I ordinarily like the narration to be done by the author of a book, in this case I might have made an exception. Somebody other than the author would have made for easier listening. ... Lastly, one word of caution: Lagrone is a devout Catholic. Yes his language in the book, which did not bother me, might be considered offensive to some readers.



How to Use 'Do Not Disturb' on Your Phone (While Still Letting Important Calls Through)

Group texts and Slack messages constantly buzz day in and day out, and occasionally, texts and calls will come in while some of us are sleeping or busy - which leads to more texts, crying foul at those who have the nerve to wake us up.

Instead of fighting a losing battle against night texters and bosses who won't stop messaging you after hours, you can use some of your phone's built-in settings to silence those notifications, without worrying about missing the really important ones. Here's how to configure Do Not Disturb mode to let calls through from certain people, at certain times, or only in case of emergency.
