
A. Cynthia, my beautiful bride, and I enjoyed a delicious dinner at Vinnie's on Merimon Ave.






3. FYI

A. Cynthia and I saw ORIGIN at Grail Moviehouse. It is a movie based on a book, CASTE: THE ORIGINS OF OUR DISCONTENTS, and it told the story of how the author went about writing the book. We found it interesting, though it felt like we were back in college taking a Sociology class. We also think it might have worked better as a documentary.

The other problem we had with the film was that it featured several stories that we wanted to see covered in greater detail, but they were were way too short.

Aunjanue Ellis-Taylor was fine in the leading role. Rate PG-13.

- B. Better in our opinion was THE BANKER, which we saw on Apple TV+. The historical drama about two entrepreneurs who hatch an ingenious business plan to fight for housing integration and equal access to the American Dream was inspired by true events. Anthony Mackie and Samuel L. Jackson both excel in the leading roles. Rated PG-13.
- C. We both did not like KILLERS OF HE FLOWER MOON, a fact-based drama about America's relationship with Indigenous peoples. The pace was too slow, and it was way too long. What was excellent was the cinematography, as well as Lily Gladstone's performance. Robert De Niro was also quote good, but we only thought Leonardo DiCaprio was OK in his role. Rated R.

Fact Checking Resources and Media Bias Chart

All news is biased. It's not the bias that is the problem, it's the not knowing what the bias of your source is. Ad Fontes, which is Latin for to the source, evaluates over 1200 sources using a "a rigorous, reproducible methodology – and a politically balanced team of analysts – to rate that content, both for bias and for reliability."

Apple is urging everyone to update iPhone and iPad iOS (again). Why you should do it now. by Jessia Guynn

This week Apple rushed out an emergency patch to fix a serious security flaw for iPhones and iPads.

The zero-day vulnerability which allows attackers to elevate privileges may have already been exploited, Apple said.

Apple patched the flaw in the iOS 17.0.3 and iPadOS 17.0.3 updates. It did not provide additional details.

"This update provides important bug fixes, security updates and addresses an issue that may cause iPhone to run warmer than expected," Apple said.

After a moment he replies, "I dunno, but you can bet your ass it's not going to be Cheerios!"




Writer Elizabeth Gilbert Shares Her Unexpected Secret to Success
