
(3) Attended a Rotary luncheon at the Renaissance Hotel with Davyne Dial, WPVM's dynamic general manager.





A. Saw A DOG'S WAY HOME, a drama about a dog who gets separated from her owner and sets off on 400-mile journey to get back to the place she calls home. Along the way, she meets a series of both new friends and challenges. I found it mildly interesting. Dog owners and young children might find it too sad for their liking. Rated PG.

B. Read ERNIE: THE AUTOBIOGRAPHY (Citadel) by Earnest Borgnine, the versatile actor who took on Frank Sinatra in FROM HERE TO ETERNITY, had us cry at his Oscar-winning role in MARTY and kept us laughing in television sitcom MCHALE'S NAY. Along the way, he appeared in such other popular films as THE DIRTY DOZEN, BAD DAY AT BLACK ROCK, THE POSEIDON ADVENTURE and bunch of others acting well into his 90s. ... This engaging book gives a behind-the-scenes look at all the above, as well as the author's recollections about working with such icons as Spencer Tracy, James Stewart, Kirk Douglas, Montgomery Clift, Gary Cooper, Janet Leigh, Raquel Welch, Gene Hackman, Rock Hudson, Sammy Davis, Jr., Tony Curtis, Alan Ladd, Glenn Ford and Burl Lancaster. ... Much of his writing is upbeat and quite often humorous--even when referring to his five marriages. He has mostly good things to say about everybody with the key exception of Ethel Merman, his third wife of just 32 days. I'm glad that Borgnine at least got it right with last wife, Tova Traesnaes, who he was married from 1973 until his death in 2012. ... If you're a movie fan, you will love this book.
