I have seen clear change in the area of feeling safe in my body which has had chronic pain and weakness for a very long time.


Today, I was in the bathroom, and I tripped over a stool. The stool tipped upside down, and somehow I managed to catch myself before having a bad fall.



## E. AMERICAN NIGHTMARE: Now on Netflix



# 9. Technology tip

To find your Wi-Fi password In Windows, go to the "Network and Sharing Center." Right-click on the Wi-Fi network connection icon > Wireless Properties. Click on Show Characters box to show your Wi-Fi password.

In macOS, all passwords are stored in the Keychain app. Use Spotlight to find "Keychain Access." Open the app and find your Wi-Fi network name in the list of saved credentials. Double-click it and then click the box to show your password. (It will require your OS level password.)


