(2) Enjoyed a recent dinner we had with our friends, Marvin Sadovsky and Annemarie Brown, at Green Sage.








***** BLAINESWORLD BEST AWARD *****

2. FYI

If you're near or past the age of collecting Social Security, I thought you would like to see this update from BLAINESWORLD #1166 that contained the following tip from Ed Kohlhepp, my financial guru:

Here is an example where a married couple can benefit when full parties have had significant lifetime earnings. Let's assume the husband reaches Full Retirement age, FRA, and files for benefits. The spouse, the wife, can collect her benefits at Full Retirement age, or alternatively, file and suspend her benefits until age 70. This enables her to collect a spousal benefit until age 70 at which time she switches to her own, higher benefit. Thus, the couple can generally collect higher benefits and still increase their lifetime benefits as a couple.

You may not have noticed that the links connected to the information are from 2015. I think this information from the SSA may be more current, and if I read it correctly, the rules have changed and the spouse can not collect 1/2 of the other's SS then switch at full retirement age. The law passed at the end of 2015 essentially eliminated that loophole. Anyway, I could be reading it wrong, which is why we have an accountant and financial planner to help us navigate this. 
