

### 1. Reflections








B. During the week, I:



A. Saw NEWSIES, a filmed version of the Tony Award-winning musical that was shot on-stage in Los Angeles last September featuring members of the original Broadway cast. It featured Tony nominee Jeremy Jordan as rebelious paperboy Jack Kelly, Kara Lindsay as Katherine, Ben Fankhauser as Davey and Andrew Keenan-Bolger as Crutchie, and they were all excellent. But what really blew me away was the choreography. You'll love both it and the film. B. Saw 1988's A CRY IN THE DARK--aka EVIL ANGELS. It's a fact-based Australian drama about a working class woman accused of killing her daughter. Meryl Streep earned her eighth Oscar nomination for her work in this film. She didn't win one this time, but she could have ... she was that good. So was Sam Neill as her husband. Rated PG-13.

C. Read 29 GIFTS: HOW A MONTH OF GIVING CAN CHANGE YOUR LIFE (Brightside Communications) by Cami Walker. ... The author, diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in 2006, kept having negative thoughts about what her future would bring. Then she received an unusual prescription from a friend, an African medicine woman named Mbatl Creazzo. Give 29 gifts in 29 days. "By giving," Creazzo told her, "you are focusing on what you have to offer others, inviting more abundance into your life." So that's what Walker started to do, and her life began changing for the better almost immediately. Her gifts weren't lavish, nor were they expensive. They included such things as making a call, writing a creative poem to be read aloud at a friend's birthday party, giving flowers to strangers and donating money to a worthy cause even when she was in debt herself. ... I also enjoyed reading the stories submitted by others, as well as the last part of the book written by Creazzo, in which she shared the history of the 29-day giving ritual.

D. Heard HOW TO TALK DIRTY AND INFLUENCE PEOPLE: AN AUTOBIOGRAPHY (Hachette Audio), written by Lenny Bruce and read by Ronnie Marmo. ... I had heard bits and pieces about his life, but didn't know his whole story until I read this book, and I'm glad I did. ... For those not familiar with who he was, he was a comedian who was prosecuted and arrested for material that is now common on cable TV. His efforts cleared the way for all those who followed him, including George Carlin, Richard Pryor and Joan Rivers, among others, who would never have been allowed to perform their material had it not been for Bruce. ... I got a special kick out of his description of his Jewish upbringing on Long Island (in an area not far from where I grew up), along with his retelling of his beginnings as a stand-up comedian. ... Tragically, he died at the age of 40 as the result of an accidental overdose. ... If you're a comedy fan, this is a book that should be a must read for you.


