A. Find ZION, a short documentary, on Netflix. It is the story of Zion Clark, a young wrestler born without legs who grew up in foster care. I found it both powerful and moving--and only wish it had been longer.

B. READ THE ROSUL OF KINDNESS: THE SURPRISING SECRET THAT GENERATES LONG-TERM RESULTS (Inspire Kindness) by Brian Biro and Mac Anderson. This short, powerful book shows you how kindness can transform your brand, your customer, your success in attracting and retaining fantastic people, and your organization into something much greater than what currently might be the case. Perhaps more importantly, you'll also be able to get ideas from it on how you can apply the concept to your personal life.

As noted by the authors, "Serving as a Chief Kindness Officer is not rocket science. In fact, it is best to adhere to the KISS principle--Keep It Simple Superstar--to master this role. There are seven powerful habits of kindness to develop as a CKO. They are as important at home with family as they are at work with teammates and customers."

You'll learn each of these seven habits, as well as to apply them in my favorite section of the book that gives advice on how to combine kindness and gratitude to create an unstoppable combination. For example, it can be as simple as commemorating the day a co-worker joined your team by sending him or her a hand-written card that said something about how they were such an important member of the team.

I also liked the many quotes throughout the book, including this one from Sam Walton, founder of Wal-Mart: "Appreciate everything you associate with for the business. Nothing else can quite substitute for a few well-chosen, well-timed sincere words or praise. They're absolutely free and worth a fortune."

Lastly, the book concludes with stories about some remarkable leaders who helped build their businesses with kindness. In particular, I liked reading about how Howard Schultz, the founder of Starbucks, helped build his business by offering his part-time employees a rate of pay that was more than the going wage and health benefits found nowhere else in the restaurant industry.
