

This week, it goes to Murray Raphael--my longtime friend and marketing guru--who recently passed away.

Murray or as I told everybody, "my friend Murray," was a big influence on my life. I first met him in the 1980s as a result of a freelance job I had at the time, i.e., covering meetings for DIRECT MARKETING MAGAZINE. I had a prior comrte, so I sent a student in my place. The student came back and told me that Murray was a terrific speaker. He also told me that Murray had given him a book for me to read (THE GREAT BRAIN ROBBERY).

I remember reading it and taking notes on virtually every page. Shortly thereafter, I wrote Murray a thank you note, and he immediately responded.

We continued writing back and forth and then Murray invited me to hear him speak in Atlantic City. Afterward, we had our first of a number of meals together.

I was fortunate to get to hear Murray speak several more times, and I was honored when he asked me to speak at a conference he organized. In addition, he heard me speak at another conference, and he gave me valuable feedback that I still remember.

For some 20 years, I used THE GREAT BRAIN ROBBERY as my text for the marketing classes that I taught at Bucks County Community College. When it became out of print, I switched to another brilliant book he wrote, UP THE LOYALTY LADDER.





A. Saw ISNT IT ROMANTIC, a feel-good romantic comedy about a woman who is knocked unconscious after an encounter with a mugger--and then wakes up to find that her life has become something she has always despised: a romantic comedy. If you're in the mood for a sweet film that has some satirical bite, you'll enjoy this one. Rebel Wilson is delightful in the leading role. Rated PG-13.

READ HOW TO RETIRE THE CHEAPSKATE WAY: THE ULTIMATE CHEAPSKATE'S GUIDE TO A BETTER, EARLIER, HAPPIER RETIREMENT (Crown Business) by Jeff Yeager, the official "Savings Expert" for AARP and its 40+ million members. ... This book features interviews with real-life stories of frugal retirees, along with people of all ages. Those were informative, and I also liked the author's breezy style of writing.

But what I enjoyed most the hundreds of retirement tips and savings, including:
* Reduce your dependency on money as much as possible, thereby reducing your need for greater cash flow.
* Consistently living below our means throughout your working years is one of the most important keys to retiring better, earlier, and happier. It allows you to save for retirement, conditions you to living on a fixed budget, and lets you avoid having to gamble on risky investments to make up for lost investing time.
* Volunteer at theater and concerts. Over the course of ten years Madeline has been ushering, she's saved at least \$12,000 in ticket costs, something she's all too happy to sing about.

And perhaps my favorite one was this:
* How would you like to have an extra \$600,000 saved for your retirement. According to a fascinating but shocking chart put together by the website CreditLoan.com, titled "The Lifetime of Debt: The financial journal of the Average American" ..., that's how much the average American is now projected to pay in interest over the course of his or her lifetime. It makes me nauseous even thinking about it.

Don't feel you have to be retired or close to retirement age to enjoy this book. Methinks you'll benefit from it at almost age.

This controversial documentary features the story of two of Michael Jackson's former child friends who have come forward to discuss alleged sexual abuse they received at the Neverland Ranch.


C. FREE SOLO: Sun., March 3, at 9 p.m. on National Geographic Channel

Gary James: 15 unwritten rules of communicating in the digital age, according to people on Twitter


- 1. Don't randomly FaceTime people. If you want to Facetime, shoot them a text or call first.
