A. Cynthia, my beautiful bride, and I:



(3) We also enjoyed a recent dinner at TGI Fridays. Tyler was our fine server.




B. During the week, I:



A. Saw FREE SOLO, last year's Academy Award winner for Best Documentary. It is a breathtaking portrait of free soloist Alex Honnold as he prepared to achieve his lifelong dream: climbing the face of the world's most famous rock (the 3,000ft El Capitan in Yosemite National Park) without a rope. The RGB photography is incredible, as is the story. Rated PG-13.

Note: As much as I liked the above film, I still think RGB about Ruth Bader Ginsburg should have beaten it out for Best Documentary. And I'm still shaking my head that the documentary about Fred Rodgers, WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR?, didn't even get a nomination.

B. Enjoyed the 2002 version of THE COUNT OF MONTE CRISTO, the classic swashbuckling tale about an honest sailor who is framed for a crime he didn't commit. James Caviezel is fine in the leading role, and I thought Guy Pearce made for a most dastardly villain. I also liked the work of Luis Guzman as Caviezel's sidekick. Rated PG-13.

Note: While I liked the above, I believe the 1934 version is even better. It stars Robert Donat, and if you can find it, do so.

I had no idea who was sending it or what what was wanted. Another problem: Such emails frequently wind up in my spam folder.

Here's a much better way to send the same email:

Interview idea for your radio show?from Kiesa

Or:

What about an interview on this show?from Kiesa

A final thought: If you don't get a response to your initial email, wait 2 or 3 days and then write again—using a different subject line. If you still don't get a response, then make a call—to the person you're trying to reach.


