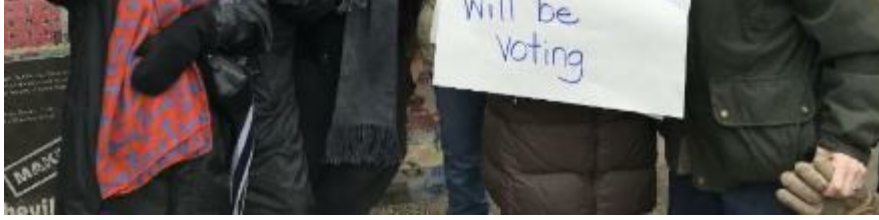

A. Saw KEEP THE CHANGE, a romantic comedy about two adults on the autism spectrum who meet in a support group. The film dragged a bit, in the beginning, but came together by the end. It's very sweet. I was also impressed by the performances, many of them who are amateurs with no prior acting experience. Rated NR, but I don't think it is appropriate for young teenagers because of the sexual language of much of the dialogue.

B. Find FREQUENCY, a 2000 thriller about time travel. Dennis Quaid and Jim Cavizel are both terrific, playing a firefighters and his son who connect via an old ham radio. If you can suspend disbelief, you'll find this film enjoyable. Rated PG-13.

C. Heard SHOE DOG: A MEMOIR BY THE CREATOR OF NIKE (Simon & Schuster Audio), written by Phil Knight and read by Norbert Leo Butz. ... Unlike Amazon and Apple, the history of Nike wasn't very well known--at least not be me. But when Knight stepped down as the company's chairman in June, 2016, he finally decided that it was time to tell the story. ... And what a story it is. I especially liked learning how the company built much of its success with the help of partners and, also, how it let people be themselves. ... One way he did this was to use something he learned from General Patton: "Don't tell people how to do things. Tell them what to do and let them surprise you with their results." ... SHOE DOG is a good book for read for those who like autobiographies of successful business executives, as well as for both runners and fans of the Nike brand.

Benedict Cumberbatch stars as kids' book author Stephen Lewis, still reeling from the disappearance three years earlier of his beloved 4-year-old daughter.

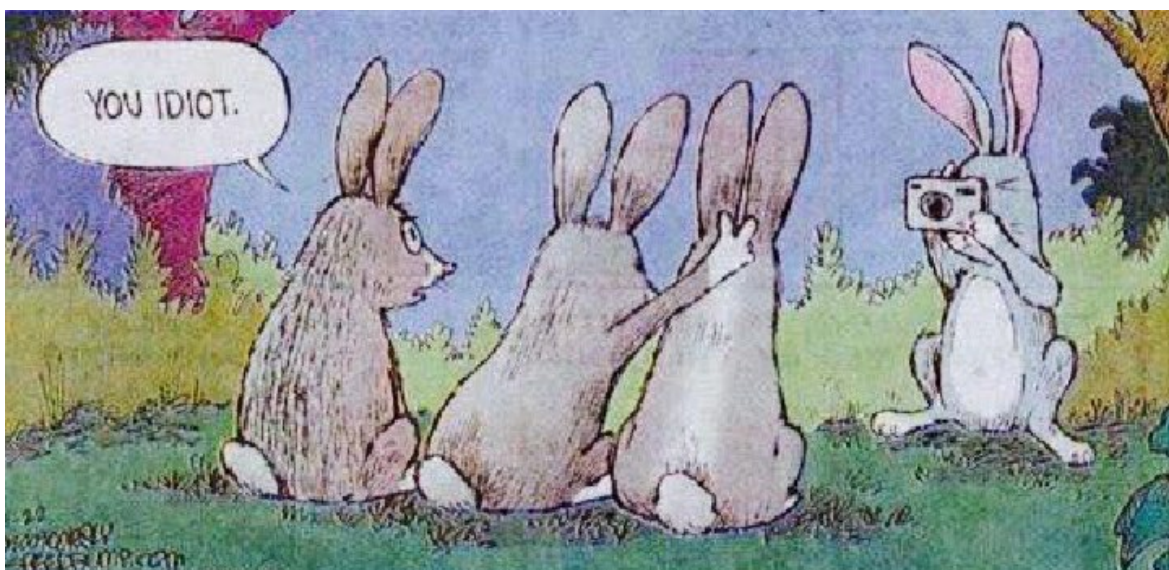
