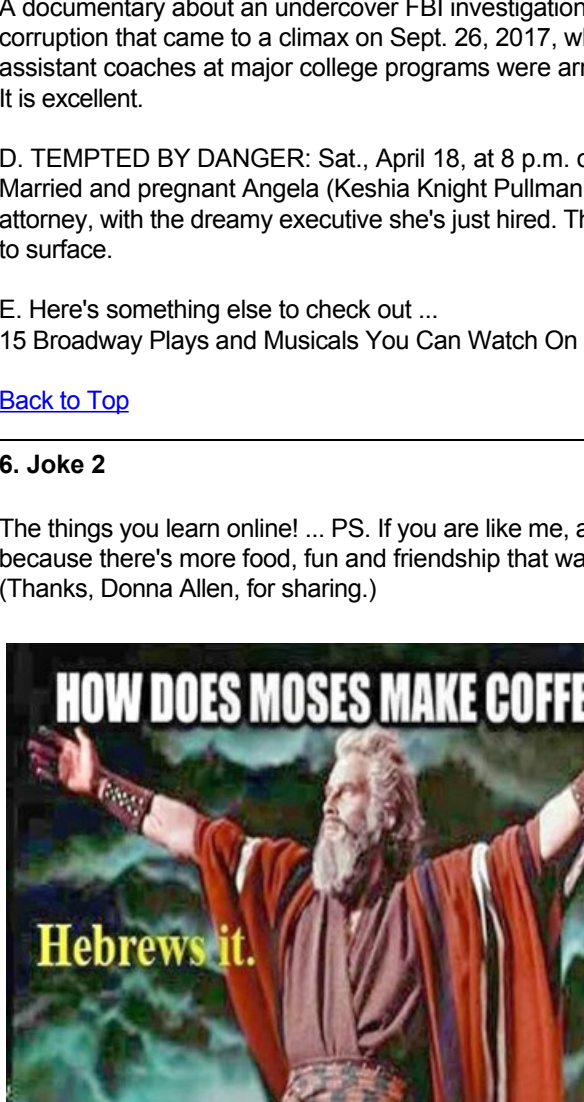
1. Date: Wednesday, April 15, at 7 p.m.

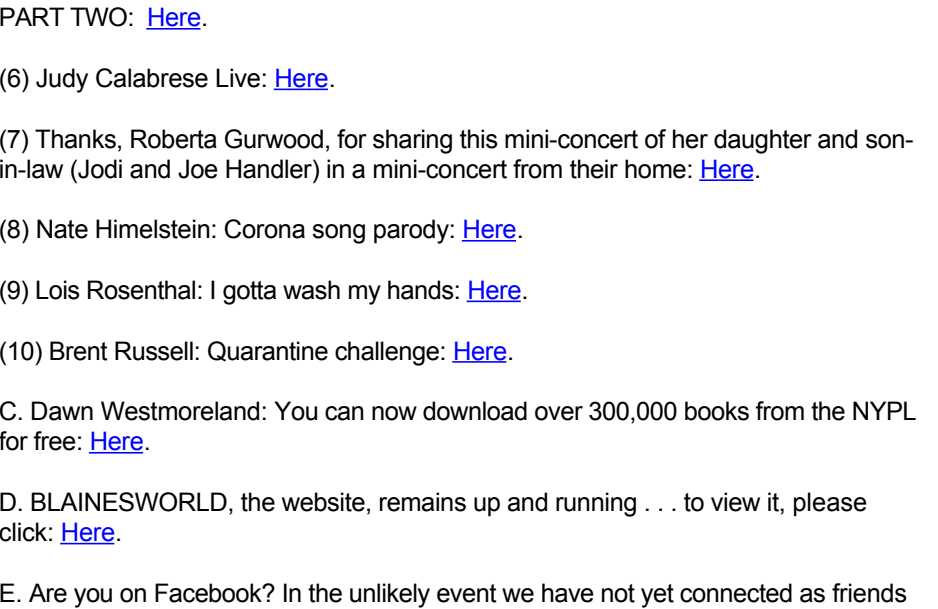

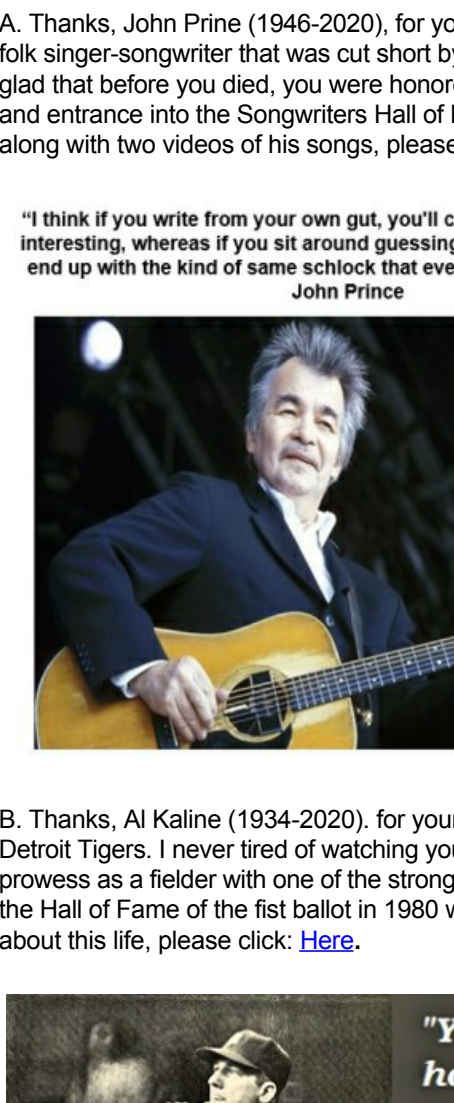
I just wanted to say THANK YOU for all of your messages, emails, and comments. It means the world to me to know how many people from all over the world are benefiting from this resource list.

There, they were able to participate in summer sports and make out sessions, and they began to become fulfilled as human beings. ... Eventually, many of them migrated to Berkeley, California, where they helped secure life-changing accessibility for millions. ... The film had me both laughing and crying and, at the end, cheering. It is not to be missed. ... Rated R for some language and sexual references, but I think it is appropriate for teenagers—and should be seen by them.
