
B. Our friends Padma Dyvine and Will Redish joined us for some tasty Chinese take-out at our home.



When my father was declining from Alzheimer's disease, one of the things my siblings and I used to argue about was whether to correct his confusions.



A. Cynthia and I both liked TWO LOVERS on Amazon Prime. It is a 2009 romantic drama, starring Joaquin Phoenix as a moody photographer who moves in with his parents in Brighton Beach. He soon becomes involved with Vanessa Shaw, an honest and sensible young woman, who appears to be the perfect match until Gwyneth Paltrow enters the picture. The performances are all outstanding, as is both the score and cinematography. Rated R.

B. We didn't feel quite the same way about THE HUSTLE, also on Amazon Prime. which was a 2019 remake of DIRTY ROTTEN SCOUNDRELS (a far superior film). Anne Hathaway and Rebel Wilson are ordinarily quite good in various roles, but they just don't click in this one. Even the cons they pull off weren't very funny. Rated PG-13.

The farmer is surprised and exclaims, "How can there be 40? I only bought 38!"


