

Note: Try the Biscuit French Toast. It is deliciously decadent.




Note: Be hungry when you go there. The sandwiches are quite large.



When sick last week, I revisited these two films that I really enjoyed:

Saw THE REMAINS OF THE DAY, a moving drama about a butler in a prosperous British household of the 1930s that is so devoted to serving his master that he ignores what is happening in both his family and in the real world. Anthony Hopkins and Emma Thompson were both superb in the leading roles, and seeing Christopher Reeve in the film made me realize how sad it was that he died too young. Rated PG, but probably not very interesting to anybody under the age of 13.

B. Also saw LOVELY & AMAZING, a bittersweet dramedy about a confused trio of daughters. Catherine Keener is such a fine actor that shines in her role, as does Emily Mortimer. The film is quirky and extremely watchable. Rated R.

If there's one digital tool I rely on as much as Gmail, it's Google Calendar.






