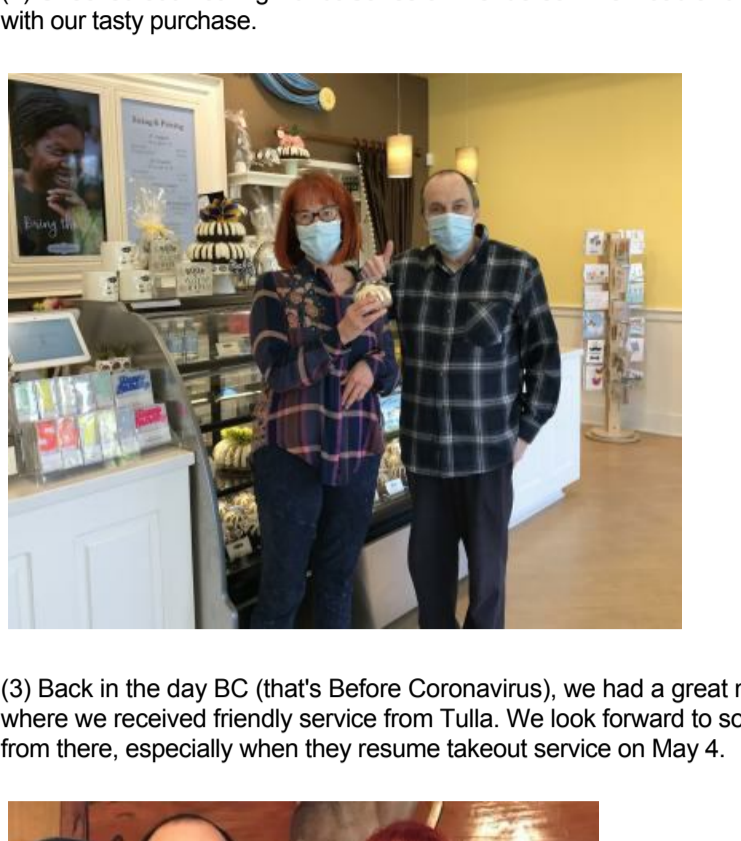

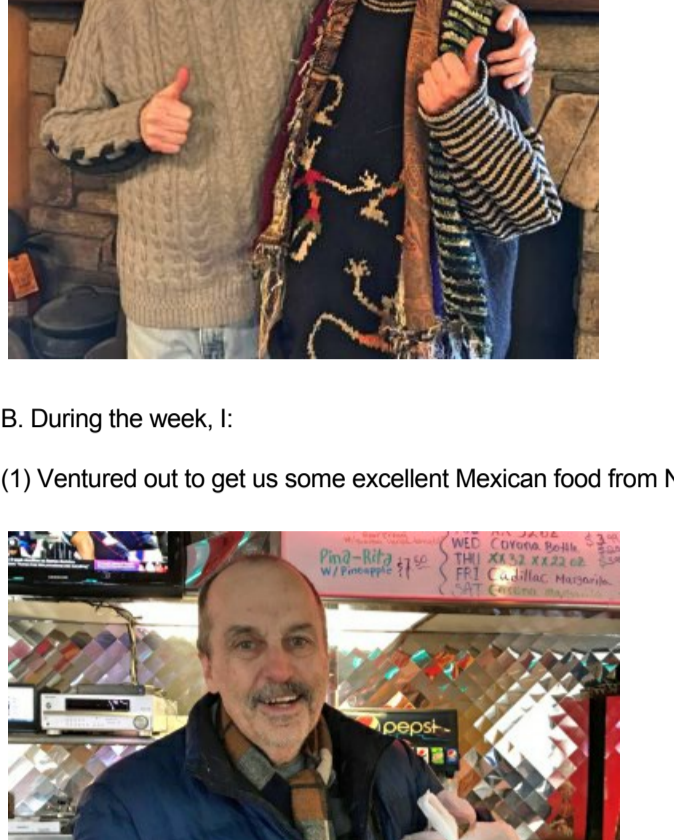

- (2) Checked out Nothing Bundt Cakes on Hendersonville Road and were delighted with our tasty purchase.

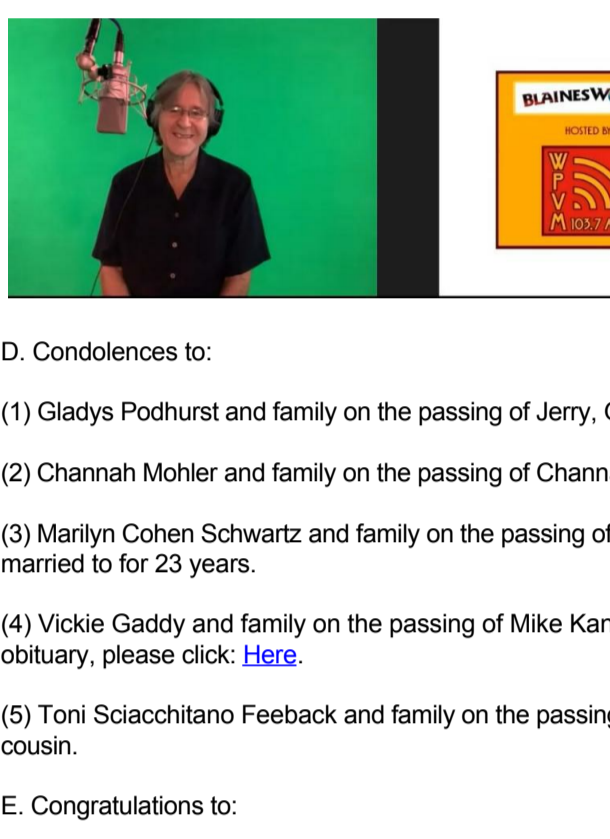

A. Saw BAD EDUCATION via HBO, but if you don't have HBO, put it down for a film to see when it appears on Netflix and/or Amazon. Inspired by true events, it tells the story of two administrators who reign over a popular Long Island school district that becomes embroiled in an embezzlement scene. Hugh Jackman and Allison Janney are excellent in the leading roles. I really enjoyed this, and you will too--particularly if you live in the Asheville area where a similar scandal involved individuals in city government. Rated NR, but appropriate for anybody over the age of 12.

B. I don't ordinarily include films I dislike, but will make an exception with this one: THE KILLING OF A SACRED DEER. This creepy thriller is about a family whose idyllic existence is threatened by a fatherless teen. It is as bad as anything I've seen in quite some time. It is also ultra violent. Rated R.

Quotes from two reviewers echo my sentiments:
M. Faust: "I suppose the best thing to be said for The Killing of a Sacred Deer is that it would be even worse if we cared about any of the people in it."
And Calvin Wilson: "This is the feel-bad film of the year. Recommend it to someone you hate."

Note: The director, Yorgos Lanthimos, is responsible for THE LOBSTER--another film that several others have told me to miss.
