


D. Cynthia is looking good, as always, modeling this T-shirt.



A. If you're a dog lover, you're going to love A DOG'S JOURNEY, a follow-up to 2017 A DOG'S PURPOSE. But methinks that even if you don't fit into that category, you're still going to like this sweet tale of Bailey who passes through several lives filled with love, friendship and devotion. ... I actually thought the plot was better in this film. Josh Gad again does a fine job as the voice-over talent, and Dennis Quaid is as earnest and believable as ever. ... Rated PG.

B. Heard AMERICAN HEIRESS: THE WILD SAGA OF THE KIDNAPPING, CRIMES AND TRIAL OF PATTY HEARST (Random House Audible), written by Jeffrey Toobin and narrated by Paul Michael. ... I followed this case closely when it happened back in the 1970s, in large part because I had been a neighbor of Steven Weed--Hearst's then boyfriend at the time of her kidnapping. ... It was a fascinating story, too, and it kept the nation engrossed for several years. ... Toobin's book is a page turner. You'll enjoy it--even if you're not familiar with Hearst. It will also make you wonder what you would have done had you been placed in a similar situation.
