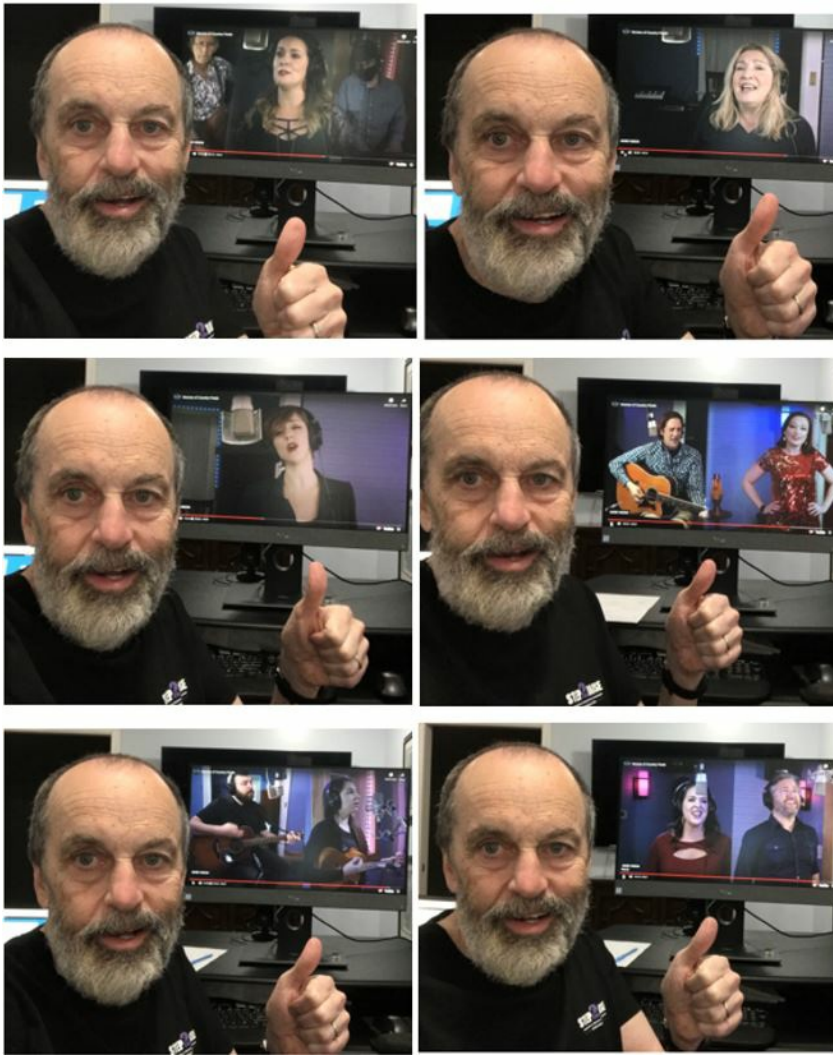

If you're shipping books, educational materials, or digital media you'll want to know about USPS Media Mail.

USPS Media Mail is typically the cheapest way to ship items defined as educational materials. This includes books, CDs, DVDs, and digital recordings used for education. Figuring out exactly what qualifies can be tricky – comic books don't count?! – so we'll cover the specifics in full below.

Shipping USPS Media Mail can save you money if you don't mind longer delivery times. And some restrictions do apply.

Note: Don't be fooled if you are told that it takes additional time to mail something this way. Almost always, I get it to my desired recipient in just about the same amount of time had I shipped it using regular mail. Just be

aware, though, if you use Media Mail, you can't include anything extra; e.g., notes, cards, etc.

The best part about seeing the above is that it was the first film we've seen away from home in well over a year. Also, we got to see it at the new location of our favorite local theatre, The Grail Moviehouse, where we were greeted by the friendly faces of Davida Horwitz and Steve White.

Having watched the wonderful new movie "Cruella" twice over Memorial Day Weekend, I found myself confronted by how my own expressions of cruelty evolved, expressed themselves throughout my life, and currently express themselves in my present day.

Part of the reason I watched the movie twice was boredom and loneliness, certainly sources of cruelty in themselves, but the reason "Cruella" temporarily solved these problems was its a highly stylized, extremely sophisticated, and fast-paced exploration of the transformation of a wide-eyed and innocent sprite of a girl named Estella, into an amoral, revengeful, narcissistic character oblivious to the levels of suffering she imposes on her closest "friends," rescuers and even mother-and-child relations.

(In a word, Trump).

All accelerated to a joyous gallop by 37, count `em, super-cool songs of the `60s, crescendo-ing into the "most obvious song you can think of for a character whose last name is de Vil and for whom we feel sympathy," said Katie Rife in her review of the film for AV Club. ...

Emma Stone is perfectly cast as Estella transforming into Cruella, and Emma Thompson as her fashion-icon nemesis, the Baroness von Hellman. And the possible, hopeful conclusion that Disney studios has finally transcended its "Bamby," "Leave It to Beaver," and "best of all possible" world's naivete to direct its admitted genius down more realistic paths that actually help or assuage our sometimes awesome, sometimes -horrible human condition --- instead of just pretend it's not there.

Another amazing aspect is there's nary a speck of sexuality in a movie mostly about the fashion biz, so in a bizarro type of way, Disney is sticking to its asexual guns, while heightening mischievous horror to Hitlerian levels, yet somehow maintaining it all in good dirty fun. Even while, on the other hand, the movie is also exploring alternative sexualities.

What a movie!

Could it even help America shed its Disney aspect of phony innocence, American Exceptionalism and imperial self-righteousness, and so explore our lengthening shadow of gratuitous violence, casual imperial brutality, and massive dominance by the military industrial complex? No. That will have to be the sequel: "Cruella Does The World."

Why would anyone want more Instagram followers?" sighed a friend two summers ago. "Mine just plague me with emojis in the comments." With 8,000 fans, she could get 300 likes just by aiming her phone down and haphazardly photographing her feet. I'd attracted a mere 950 followers; none was blindly interested in photos of my limbs. This seemed problematic. As the editor of a newspaper's lifestyle section when Instagram was increasingly defining lifestyle trends, I considered it a professional duty to conquer the platform and acquire

enough followers to be plagued at least a little. Besides, I was feeling competitive.

Mastering the science of growing my account became my summer project. To prepare, I watched dozens of YouTube videos in which platform pros talked very fast, outlining “tricks” and “secrets.” Here are the 10 strategies I considered or tested, driving my follower count up 20% in three months—along with updated commentary from two of those loquacious experts.
