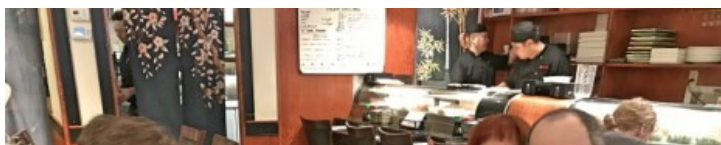

D. I got to solve all the world's problems with my friend Brian Biro over the best cheesteaks in town at Ziggy's.



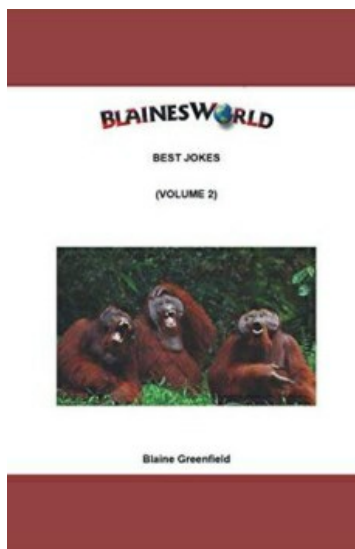

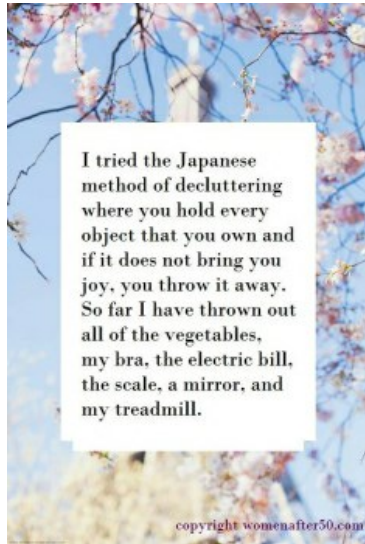

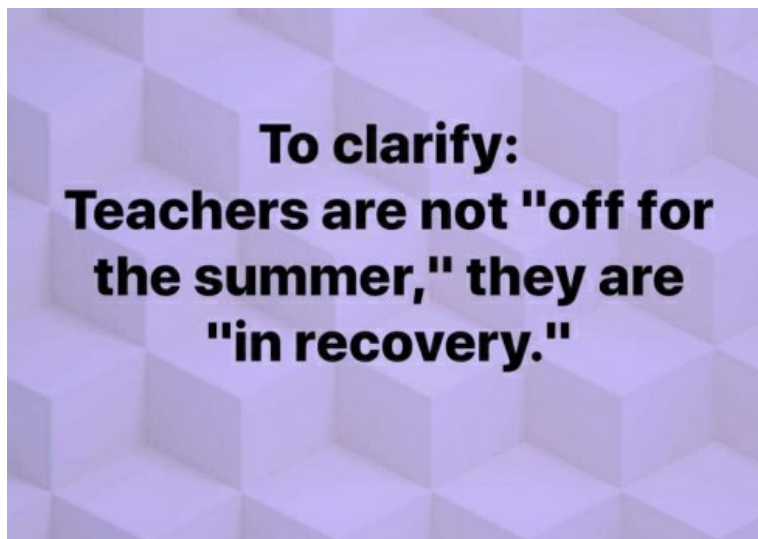
