This 8-episode sitcom has former Harvard classmates bringing out the eternal sophomore in each other.



Question (from a reader who wishes to remain anonymous): My 13-year-old son was researching "sex chats" on Google the other day. Is there anything I can do to prevent him from doing so?

Answer: Good luck with that! But you can try the following ...

1. Go to Google Chrome: [Here](#)
2. Go to "Settings" in the bottom right corner.
3. Check the box next to "Turn on SafeSearch."
4. At the bottom of the page, select Save.

Note: SafeSearch isn't 100% accurate, but it helps you avoid some explicit content.

Then run a test to see how this works. I tried doing so. Before I changed the Google safe search setting to strict, I searched for "sex chat" and encountered plenty of risqué websites. After locking the strict search, I searched again and got this message:
"Your search - "sex chat" - did not match any documents."

Success at least for the above terms. Unfortunately, this does not work on all terms. Also, this works if you use Google as your search engine of choice. If you did use AOL, then you'll have to use what AOL recommends to block sites. The same applies to Foxfire, Bing, etc.
