

They were in the middle of a recording session for their group, The Raindrops, and realized they needed a B-side for their single, "That Boy John". The duo then went into the hall and penned the song in 20 minutes. Barry and Greenwich weren't particularly pleased with the song and deemed it inferior to the rest of their work. "I was surprised when [Tommy James' version] was released," After appearances on TV and in clubs in the city, Tommy James took a master of "Hanky Panky" to New York City, where his DJ Bob Mack sold it to Roulette Records. According to James "The amazing thing is we did not re-record the song," "I don't think anybody can record a song that bad and make it sound good. It had to sound amateurish like that. The man is stunned. Just then, the owner comes over and the man asks, "Why are you selling this amazing dog?"


