

She meets and winds up helping the big man on campus after a hazing incident left another student paralyzed. Watchable, though not great. Rated PG.

B. Revisited FAST FIVE on HBO, the fifth and one of the best in the FAST & FURIOUS franchise. Dwayne Johnson is introduced for the first time, and his performance rocks. His fight with Vin Diesel is epic. The plot isn't bad, either. Rated PG-13.

C. Read THE RACKETEER (Random House) by John Grisham, an engrossing legal thriller about an attorney wrongly imprisoned for money laundering. While in prison, he uncovers information about a federal justice and his mistress who are murdered. In return for this information, he gets released and enters the Witness Protection Program.
