Saw MARIANNE & LEONARD, a documentary about the 50+-year friendship between the poet/singer Leonard Cohen and Marianne Ihlen, a single mother with a young son at the time of their initial meeting. ... It starts on on the Greek island of Hydra in 1960 and continues to their deaths in 2016. ... For those not familiar with Cohen's fascinating life, you'll enjoy this film. I liked it, but would have wanted to see more of his music performed. ... Rated R, but I think appropriate for mature teenagers.

they don't like opera will probably enjoy this; it's a great story of a rags-to-riches talent.

Maiden - the story of the first all-female crew to sail the Whitbread around-the-world sailboat race. So inspiring, it had me - and Hans! - in tears. Should be required for all girls - but also for anyone who can use a lesson in "just because they say we can't do something is a reason to do it".

Fiction:

Sarah and Saleem - a Palestinian film about a Palestinian man and an Israeli women who have an extramarital affair with each other, with catastrophic results.

1. Unlock the screen rotate option on your phone.

2. Open Facebook and tap on live when you are holding your phone vertically.

3. Rotate your phone horizontally. Make sure you can read the print (or see the picture) at the bottom. Both should be seen horizontally.

4. Then tap the shutter button.


