

A. Cynthia and I both liked JULES, a dramedy about a guy facing dementia who lives a quiet life of routine in a small western Pennsylvania town until he finds his day upended when a UFO and its extra-terrestrial passenger crash land in his backyard. Ben Kingsley is outstanding in the leading role, and we also liked the performances of both Harriet Sansom Harris and Jane Curtin (and her rendition of "Free Bird"). ... Watching this film, you'll be reminded of a senior version of E.T. THE EXTRA-TERRESTRIAL, as well as by COCOON-- and that's high praise. Rated PG-13.

B. We loved TILL, which can now be seen on Amazon Prime. It is the true story of Mamie Till Mobley's relentless pursuit of justice for her 14-year-old son, Emmett Till, who, in 1955, was brutally lynched while visiting his cousins in Mississippi. Danielle Deadwyler is superb as the mother. I think she gave as fine a performance as you'll ever see. Why she didn't even get an Oscar nomination is beyond me. Rated PG-13.

Stallone thought the sound, writing style, and street appeal could fit in his new movie, so he called Jim Peterik and Frankie Sullivan, who were Survivor's primary songwriters and left messages on their answering machines. When we spoke with Peterik, he said, "Answering machines were still a novelty back then and to see that blinking light was a thrill. That's really the way he talks."

iPhone users will soon have to adjust to this small but significant change by Samantha Murphy Kelly

Get your thumb ready for next month. Apple (AAPL) is making a subtle change to the iPhone's software that will likely mess with your muscle memory: The big red "end call" button is moving.

The iPhone's phone app will get a series of updates coming to iOS 17, including an updated design that repositions the hang up button to the bottom right of the screen, next to other functions. The button currently

sits separately at the bottom middle of the phone app, underneath the buttons to mute, access the keypad or add a call.
