

Cynthia and I really liked THE HILL, a true story about a small-town Texas boy who shows an an extraordinary ability for hitting a baseball, despite being burdened by leg braces from a degenerative spinal disease. He also must face the opposition of his father who wants to follow his footsteps and become a preacher. Jesse Berry and Collin Ford are both outstanding as the younger and older Rickey Hill, respectively, and Dennis Quaid continues to never disappoint in the leading role as the pastor-father of the boys. I also liked the work Scott Glenn and Bonnie Bedelia in supporting roles. Rated G.

Note: I've just added this to my list of favorite films. It is faith-based, but not overly so ... and I don't think that would take away from anybody's enjoyment of this film. 
