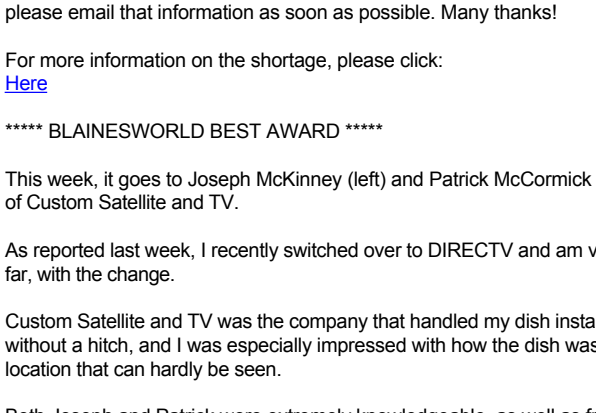

This week, it goes to Joseph McKinney (left) and Patrick McCormick (right)--owners of Custom Satellite and TV.

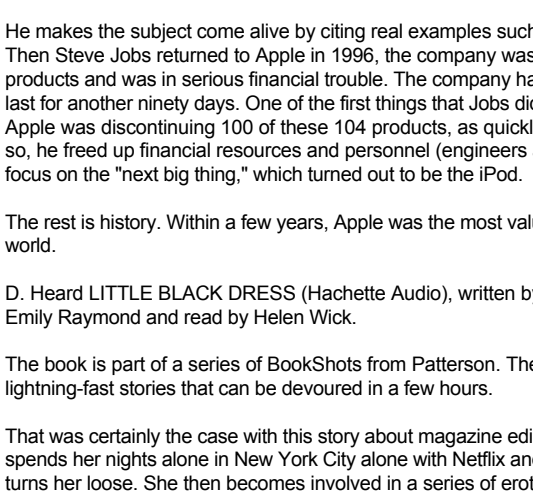
As reported last week, I recently switched over to DIRECTV and am very happy, so far, with the change.

A. SAW SULLY, the story of real-life pilot Chesley "Sully" Sullenberger who landed an Airbus A320 full of passengers on the Hudson River. Tom Hanks is terrific in the leading role, and Aaron Eckhart is also excellent as his co-pilot. The crash scene was thrilling, as was the rescue afterward. Rated PG-13.

B. Find WHAT MAISE KNEW on Netflix or wherever else it might be available. Steve Coogan, Joanna Vanderham and Alexander Skarsgard are all outstanding as the adults, but it is Onata Aprile as Maise who will knock your socks off with her performance. Rated R.

C. Read BUSINESS STRATEGY, one of the books in THE BRIAN TRACY SUCCESS LIBRARY (AMACOM) by Brian Tracy.

The author, chairman and CEO of Brian Tracy International, a company specializing in the training and development of individuals and organizations, believes that strategic planning will enable you to develop absolute clarity on priorities organize resources and get better results than ever book.

Tracy effectively uses a wide ranges of companies, including IBM, General Electric Walmart and IKEA, among others.

He makes the subject come alive by citing real examples such as this one: Then Steve Jobs returned to Apple in 1996, the company was producing 104 different products and was in serious financial trouble. The company had only enough cash to last for another ninety days. One of the first things that Jobs did was announce that Apple was discontinuing 100 of these 104 products, as quickly as possible. By doing so, it freed up financial resources and personnel (engineers and developers) to focus on the "next big thing," which turned out to be the iPod.

The rest is history. Within a few years, Apple was the most valuable company in the world.

D. Heard LITTLE BLACK DRESS (Hachette Audio), written by James Patterson with Emily Raymond and read by Helen Wick.

The book is part of a series of BookShots from Patterson. They are advertised as lightning-fast stories that can be devoured in a few hours.

That was certainly the case with this story about magazine editor Jane Avery. She spends her nights alone in New York City alone with Netflix and Oreos until a dress turns her loose. She then becomes involved in a series of erotic adventures.

If you liked SEX AND THE CITY, either the TV series or movies of the same title, you'll like LITTLE BLACK DRESSES.

My take: I found it mildly interesting, though I'm not sure I would rush out to read another book in the series. Don't read it if you are expecting one of Patterson's typical mysteries.

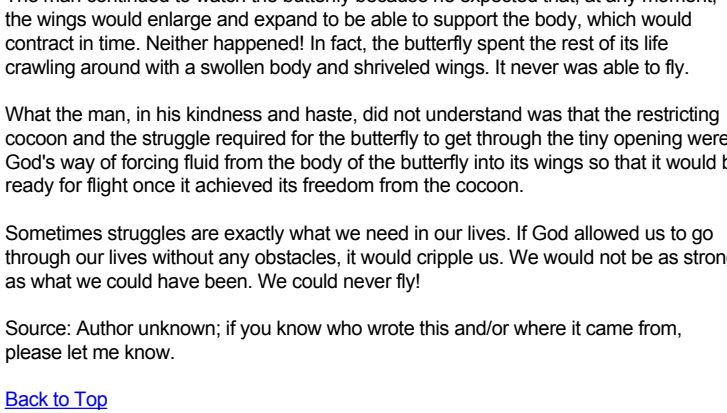
