Sen. Graham's in a tweet on May 4:



A. Now available via on disc/streaming is THE HERO. Here's my review from BLAINESWORLD #1083:
Saw THE HERO, a drama about an aging Western icon with a golden voice whose performances are way behind him. But then a cancer diagnosis changes his priorities. ... Sam Elliott is superb in the leading role, but overall, the film left me somewhat flat. I wouldn't recommend that you rush out to see it, but methinks it would be worthwhile when it becomes available via disc/streaming. ... Rated R.

Read A FRIEND LIKE HENRY: THE REMARKABLE TRUE STORY OF AN AUTISTIC BOY AND THE DOG THAT UNLOCKED HIS WORLD (Sourcebooks) by Nuala Gardner, a community nurse and qualified midwife and mother of Dale and Amy, both of whom have autism. ... This excellent book tells of how the author and her husband fought the authorities in England to have the condition of their children recognized before there was sufficient understanding of it. Fortunately, their job was made easier when an amazing dog named Henry became a part of the family and then helped Dale communicate with the rest of the world. ... According to the author, "Dale and I tried to find the words to describe his wonderful pet and couldn't, until I found this quote by Hermione Gingold, and Dale agreed it was the most suitable to remember him by: 'To call him a dog hardly seems to do him justice, though in as much as he had four legs, a tail, and barked, I admit he was, to all outward appearances. But to those of us who knew him well, he was a perfect gentleman.' " ... You'll enjoy this book even if you don't have pets or children.


