A. From the opening number, I was mesmerized by THE GREATEST SHOWMAN--a musical very loosely based on the life of P.T. Barnum. The songs (from the lyricists of LA LA LAND) were great, and the choreography was dazzling. Hugh Jackman was perfect in the leading role. There's a lot of useful information and much of it is funny, too; for example, the author's definition of comedy: "The simplest definition for what makes something funny is 'abnormality.' Like a tumor, for example. Tumors, of course, aren't funny. Which is why his definition is funny. Or because it's now impossible for me to read the word "tumor" without hearing Arnold Schwarzenegger say it, as in 'It's not a too-mah.' " ... I liked how the book covered a wide variety of topics, ranging from doing stand-up to writing for television and movies to auditioning (my favorite chapter for its useful advice) to creating a YouTube channel. ... And I liked the many interviews with such luminaries as Joan Rivers, Judd Apatow and Terry Jones. ... If you were ever interested in a career in comedy or if you just want to find out more about the industry, you'll want to read FUNNY ON PURPOSE.

What You Need to Do Because of Flaws in Computer Chips
by Cade Metz and Brian X. Chen

On Wednesday, a group of security experts revealed two security flaws that affect nearly all microprocessors, the digital brains of the world's computers. These flaws, called Meltdown and Spectre, could allow hackers to lift passwords, photos, documents and other data from smartphones, PCs and the cloud computing services

that many businesses rely on.

Some of the world's largest tech companies have been working on fixes for these problems. But the researchers who discovered the flaws said one of them, Spectre, is not completely fixable. "It is a fundamental flaw in the way processors have been built over the last decades," said Paul Kocher, one of the researchers who discovered these flaws.

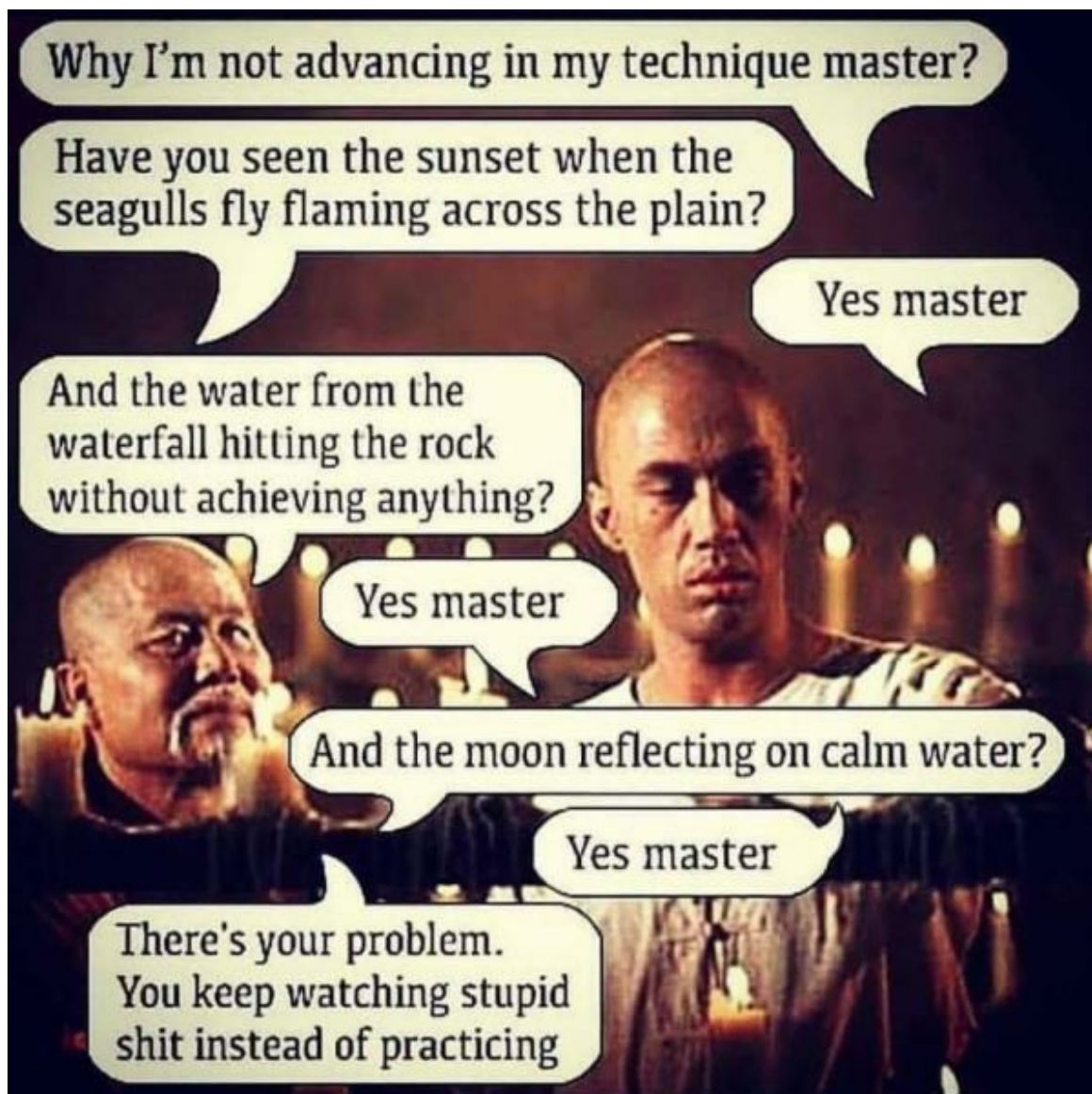
