I reviewed this book in BLAINESWORLD #1046 and enjoyed it.

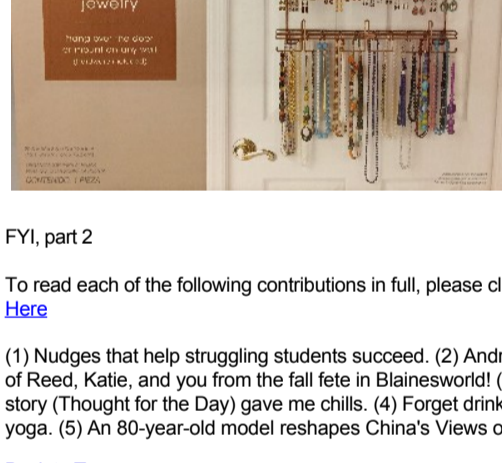

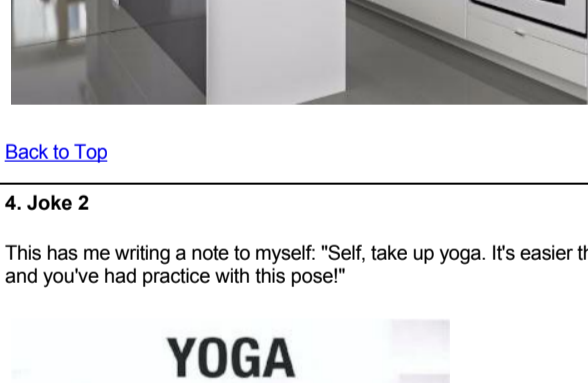

**3. Joke 1**

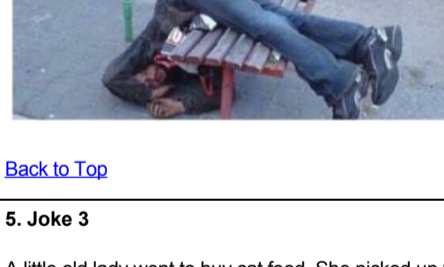
The secret to a clean kitchen is simple. Don't cook!

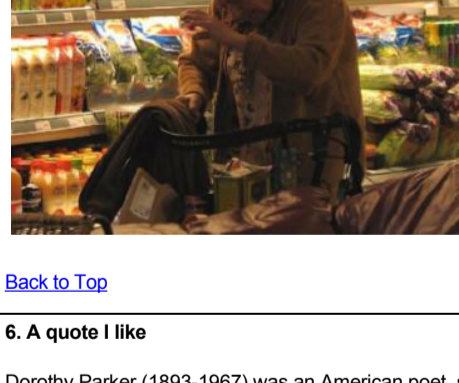
This has me writing a note to myself: "Self, take up yoga. It's easier than you thought, and you've had practice with this pose!"

**5. Joke 3**

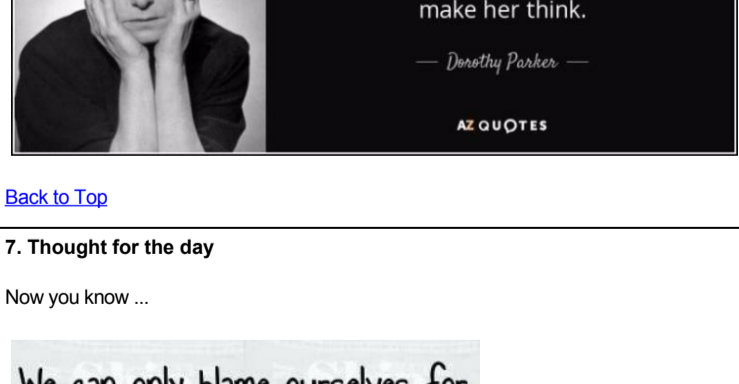

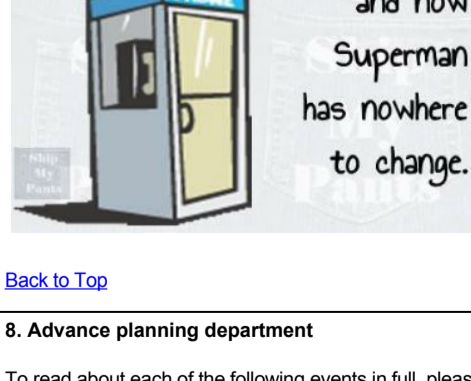

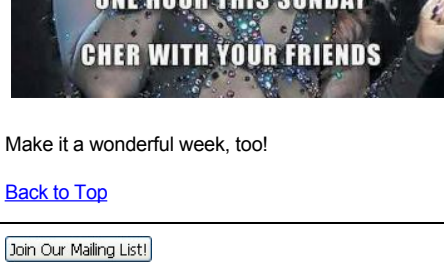
