

4. Reviews

A. Saw THE ACCOUNTANT, an action thriller about a math savant who does better with numbers than he does with people. Though he seemingly works for a small-town CPA office, in reality he is a freelancer for some of the world's most dangerous criminal organizations. Ben Affleck and Anna Kendrick are fine in the leading roles, but overall, the film didn't do very much for me. I also found it to be more violent than it needed to be. Rated R.

B. I just revisited HONEYSUCKLE ROSE, a 1980 musical about a country singer/songwriter who is popular in his native Texas, but who hasn't yet had the hit record that would make him a star nationwide. Willie Nelson is terrific in the leading role, and he is backed up by strong performances from Dyan Cannon, Slim Pickens and Amy Irving. The film's theme song, "On the Road Again," earned a well-deserved Academy Award nomination. ... If you can find this on TV, Netflix or streaming, make sure you catch it. Rated PG. ... C. Read LEADERSHIP (AMACON) one of the books in THE BRIAN TRACY SUCCESS LIBRARY by Brian Tracy. ... The author, CHAIRMAN and CEO of Brian Tracy International, a company specializing in the training and development of individuals and organizations, looks at what transforms a person into the kind of individual who inspires others to follow. He contends that this is a skill that can be learned. ... Tracy makes this easy by explaining, for example, that, "Power is having people who are loyal to you and that you can count on for favors, even though they are not subordinate to you in any way. Often, these people are ready to help you because you have helped them. It's called the Law of Reciprocity. The Law of Reciprocity says that if you do things to help other people achieve their goals, they will be compelled internally to do things to help you achieve your goals." ... I also liked his use of such real-life examples as this one: "When I conduct strategic planning exercises with corporations, I have gathered leaders to imagine a future where in five years the company was the very best in its industry. Once everyone has developed the ideal features and attributes of this future ideal company, I ask: 'Is this possible?' One by one, the executives will nod and say, 'Yes, it is possible. Maybe not in one year, but if five years, yes.' We then discuss how to reach that ideal over the next five years. Once you have a clear vision of what you want, the next question is always, 'How?' ... LEADERSHIP is an especially worthwhile book for anybody at the beginning of his or her business career.

D. Heard BITE ME: HOW LYME DISEASE STOLE MY CHILDHOOD, MADE ME CRAZY, AND ALMOST KILLED ME (Hachette Audio), written and read by Ally Hilfiger. ... The author, a producer, actress, artist, fashion designer and writer, woke up in a psych ward at the age of 18. She couldn't put a sentence together, let alone take a shower, eat a meal or pick up a phone. Although she had already produced a feature film and been on a popular reality show, she had also suffered since she was 7 with physical symptoms that included joint pain, night sweats, memory loss, nausea and brain fog. ... Fortunately, when in the psych ward, she encountered a doctor who gave her the diagnosis that she had Lyme disease. And that put her on the road to recovery that took her several more years. ... The book is interesting, in that it shows how one individual was able to finally survive many years of being misdiagnosed. What it doesn't do is give you the answer on how to cure Lyme Disease.


