

An unrecognizable Zach Galifianakis is outstanding as Warner, and he is backed up by stellar performances from Elizabeth Banks, Sarah Snook and Geraldine Viswanathan. The only thing we didn't like was the film's non-linear timetable. Rated R.

B. We recently saw THE ADJUSTMENT BUREAU on Netflix. It is a sci-fi romance thriller about a politician who meets a ballerina. He is instantly smitten, but mysterious men conspire to keep him away from the beautiful dancer. Performances from Matt Damon, Emily Blunt and Anthony Mackie were all outstanding, but overall, we only found the film moderately interesting. Rated PG-13.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, United States

A Free Book Gifting Program

In 1995, Dolly Parton launched an exciting new effort, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, to benefit the children of her home county in East Tennessee, USA. Dolly's vision was to foster a love of reading among her county's preschool children and their families. The new program gave each child a specially selected book each month. By mailing high quality, age appropriate books directly to their homes, Dolly wanted children to be excited about books and to feel the magic that books can create. Moreover, she could ensure that every child would have books, regardless of their family's income.

Since its launch, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library has set and surpassed many goals and milestones. National replication, which started in 2000, allowed more and more communities to adopt the program. State-wide coverage was established in Tennessee in 2004. Furthermore, international growth provided expansion in Canada (2006), United Kingdom (2007) and Australia (2014).

The first book order in 1995 totaled just over 1,700. Today, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library sends more than 2 million books per month to children around the world inspiring them to Dream More, Learn More, Care More and Be More.

A. (top) Thanks, Frank Borman (1928-2023), for your career as an American United States Air Force colonel, aeronautical engineer, NASA astronaut test pilot and businessman. He was the commander of Apollo 8, the first mission to fly around the Moon, and together with crewmates Jim Lovell and William Anders, became the first of 24 humans to do so, for which he was awarded the Congressional Space Medal of Honor. B. (bottom) Thanks, Frank Howard (1936-2023), for your career as an American professional baseball player, coach and manager in Major League Baseball who played most of his career for the Los Angeles Dodgers and Washington Senators/Texas Rangers franchises. Howard was named the National League's Rookie of the Year in 1960 for the Dodgers. He twice led the American League in home runs and total bases and once each in slugging percentage, runs batted in and walks. For more information about his life, click: <u>Here</u>.

I remember him because I actually saw him play in person, along with my cousin Blaine Land ("the other

Blaine"), at the first game of the 1963 World Series at the original Yankee Stadium. Batting against Whitey Ford, he hit the hardest line drive I've ever seen. It landed in fair territory, just to the left of the monuments to Yankee greats in center field--about 460 feet from home plate. He lumbered only as far as second base in what has been called the longest double in Yankee Stadium history. To see that hit for yourself, go to the 3:01 mark when you click: <u>Here</u>.

I pointed out that I was commenting on his winning record as a basketball coach and not about him as a person. Frank Howard was jut the opposite. I admired him as both a player and as a human being. 
