




11. Two quotes I like

A. Top: Henry Kissinger (1923-2023) passed this past week. He was a controversial American diplomat, political scientist, geopolitical consultant and politician who served as United States secretary of state and national security advisor in the presidential administrations of Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford between 1969 and 1977. He pioneered the policy of détente with the Soviet Union, orchestrated an opening of relations with China, engaged in what became known as shuttle diplomacy in the Middle East to end the Yom Kippur War and negotiated the Paris Peace Accords, which ended American involvement in the Vietnam War. But he has also been associated with controversial policies, such as the U.S. bombing of Cambodia during the Vietnam War, Operation Condor, U.S. involvement in the 1973 Chilean coup d'état, a "green light" to Argentina's military junta for their Dirty War and U.S. support for Pakistan during the Bangladesh Liberation War despite a genocide being perpetrated by Pakistan.
