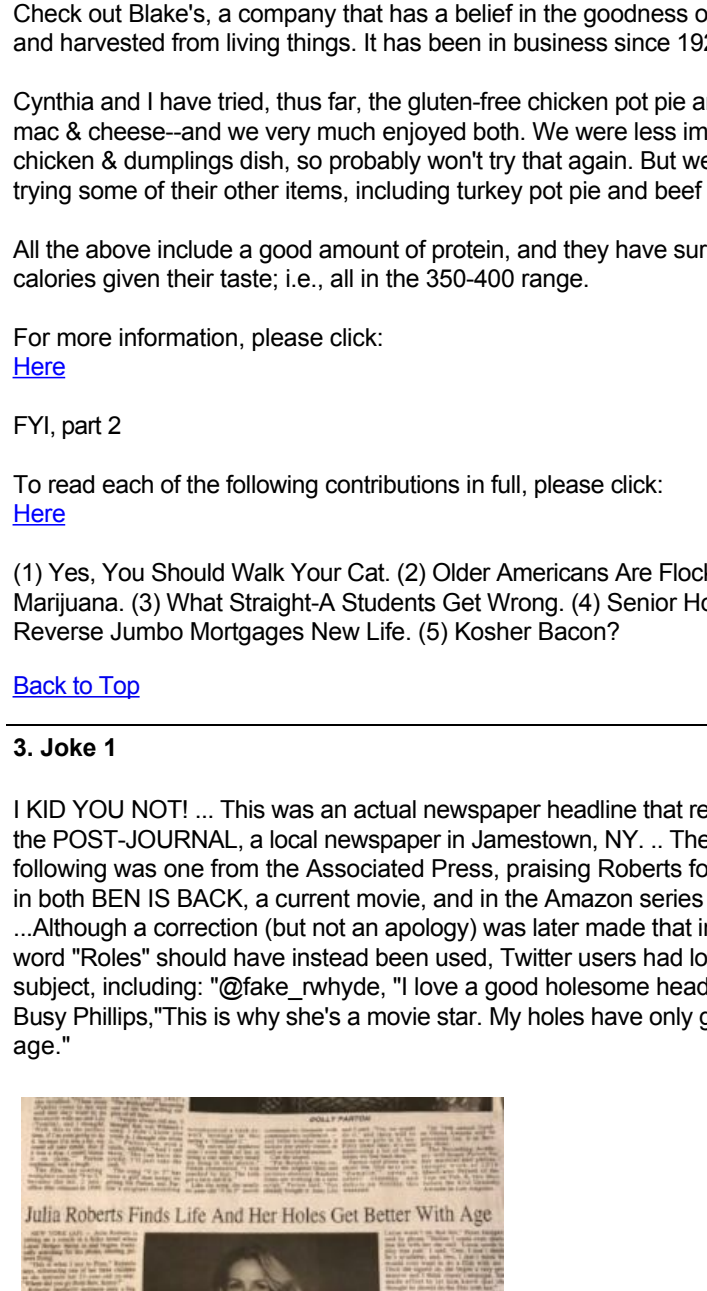

B. Saw DUMPLIN' via Netflix. It is a sweet comedy about a plus-size, teenage daughter of a former beauty queen who signs up for her mom's pageant as a protest. Things escalate when some other contestants follow her footsteps. There's a terrific soundtrack from Dolly Parton, along with fine leading performances from Danielle Macdonald and Jennifer Aniston as, respectively, the mother and daughter. I also very much liked the work of Maddie Baillio as one of the contestants. Rated PG-13.

C. READ SOLVING THE WORLD'S TITANIC STRUGGLES: ANSWERS FROM BAHAI! PHILOSOPHY AND SPIRITUALITY (ABLA Media Company) by Rodney Richards. This book is a collection of 100 short essays written between 2014 and 2017 that offer personal, practical insights into solving the world problems that divide us. Richards reinforces his points with excerpts from the Baha'i Writings on spirituality, mindfulness, reality, love, philosophy and other subjects.

I especially liked his chapter entitled, "Prosperous? Be Generous. Troubled Be Thankful." In it, he writes, "Be someone. If not for yourself, for your Mom or Dad, friend or mate, stranger or foe. ... Not and say Hello to passerbys on your street instead of keeping eyes averted or start up a conversation on the elevator with strangers. ... Teach a literacy class for zero remuneration, just for the joy of learning the craft. ... Don't just hold the door open for the old couple-wish them a blessed day. Smile back when the Walmart or Acme clerk says Good morning and say, "How's it goin'?" and listen to their answer.

His chapter on Gambling: To Wager or Work" also had valuable insights, including this one: The next time you think about placing a wager or playing a game of chance, remember how hard you worked to obtain your livelihood, and count on the power of your own labor rather than Dame Fortune-shell let you down just about every time."

SOLVING THE WORLD'S TITANIC STRUGGLES got me thinking, which is always a good thing.

Note: I also encourage you to read Richards' memoir, EPISODES, about how he dealt with overwhelming bouts of bipolar mania while living and working normally. I found it inspiring!
